

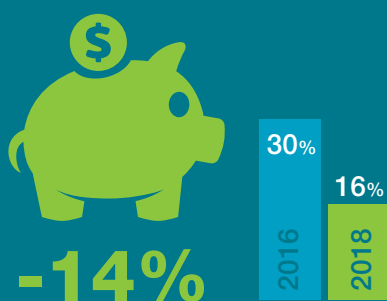
RESULTS OF 2018 BC COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH & SUBSTANCE USE SECTOR SURVEY

REVENUE AND FUNDING

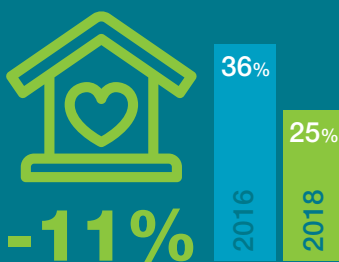
Respondents to the 2018 Sector Survey identified a **significant reduction in funds** received by community mental health and substance use organizations through earned income, private or community foundations and charitable donations in comparison to sector survey data from 2016.

These results are in alignment with national trends which see charitable giving on the decline.

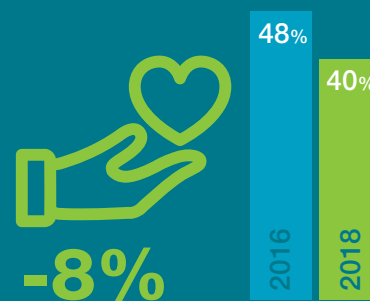
FUNDING SOURCES

CHANGES IN GOVERNMENT FUNDING

Respondents identified a **reduction in funds** received through a few governmental departments, agencies and ministries including BC Housing, Ministry of Social Development and Poverty Reduction, the Ministry of Justice, and Health Canada.



Respondents identified an **increase in funds** received through the Ministry of Child and Family Development, and the Ministry of Health.



Unchanged between 2016 and 2018, are the funds received by the sector through regional health authorities (47%) and municipalities (14%).

ABOUT THE SECTOR SURVEY

First undertaken in 2016, the BC Community Mental Health and Substance Use Sector Survey, administered by the Community Action Initiative (CAI), aims to provide a snapshot of the nature and characteristics of non-government organizations that provide mental health and substance use services in BC. The 2018 survey results reflect the responses of 101 survey participants.
